BAE lands \$10.5 million contract for armor panels

BAE Systems Inc. landed a \$10.5 million contract from **Textron Marine and Land Systems** to produce armor panels for vehicles.

BAE Systems' Security & Survivability business, which is based in Butler County, will produce armor kits for Armored Security Vehicles (ASV), which are often used to support military police missions, as well as a variety of other military operations.

Work on the contract is being performed at BAE Systems' facilities in Pheonix.

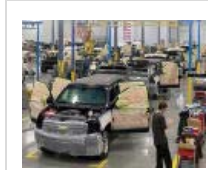
BAE **bought Dayton's MTC Technologies Inc.** in the summer of 2008 for \$450 million and a debt assumption.

The company **recently announced the layoff of 100 workers** at its Butler County facility due to lost contracts with the **U.S. Army**.
