

Homearama resumes in '11 in West Chester

WEST CHESTER - The region's largest high-end home show - Homearama - will be revived next year with plans for the event to unfold at Foxborough, a community of Cobblestone Development and The Drees Co. in Butler County.

The show will be held June 11 through 26 next year in the Glenview Estates section of Foxborough, the Home Builders Association of Greater Cincinnati announced Monday. The community is located just off Tylersville Road in West Chester. Show homes prices are slated to run from \$525,000 to \$850,000.

This year, the homebuilders cancelled Homearama as builders struggled to land financing for new home construction in light of the recession. The 2011 show will mark the 49th Homearama.
